Creeping Phlox <i>Phlox subulata</i>  	2-3 inches tall 3-4 feet spread	Evergreen <i>Hardy to minus 20 degrees</i>	Showy spring flowers, usually around March and/or April <i>Flowers purple, pink, or pink-red</i>	
Spreading Germander <i>Teucrium majoricum</i>  	3-4 inches tall 3-4 feet spread	Evergreen <i>Hardy to 15 degrees</i>	Long-blooming, early summer until a frost <i>Purple-pink blooms</i>	
Cheddar Pink <i>Dianthus</i>  	6-8 inches tall 8-12 inches wide	Evergreen <i>Hardy to minus 15 degrees</i>	Long-blooming, beginning in early spring. Flowers smell like cloves, may need to be dead-headed to keep plant looking neat. Grassy green foliage. <i>Blooms are usually pink or red, some varieties have white variegation.</i>	

Lambs Ear <i>Stachys byzantine</i> 	18-12 inches tall 18-24 inches wide 	Semi-evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Fuzzy grey leaves. Unusual flowers resemble cotton balls along stem above foliage. Blooms late spring to early summer. <i>Flowers are mostly white with touches of purple.</i> 
Tickseed <i>Coreopsis</i> 	12-18 inches tall 12-18 inches wide 	Deciduous Hardy to minus 10 degrees	Wispy green foliage melts away for winter, returns in spring. Cheery yellow flowers all summer. <i>Flowers yellow, red, or a mix of both</i> 
Wallflower <i>Erysimum</i> 	1-2 foot tall 1-3 feet spread 	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees	Showy blooms above foliage in spring. Very vibrant. Flowers may need to be cut back after bloom to keep plant tidy. <i>Flowers orange or purple</i> 
Wandflower (Gaura) <i>Gaura lindheimeri</i> 	1-3 foot tall 1-2 feet spread 	Deciduous (melts to ground for winter) Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Long-blooming, flowers above foliage starting in early summer <i>Flowers pink, pink with white, or white</i> 

Catmint <i>Nepeta</i> 	24-30 inches tall 2-3 feet wide 	Semi-evergreen Hardy to minus 20 degrees	Fragrant foliage is an attractive grey-green. Very showy and long-blooming, purple flower spikes begin in late spring. 'Chartreuse on the Loose' variety has yellow foliage. Deer rating: 9/10	
Blanket Flower <i>Gaillardia</i> 	1-3 feet tall 1-3 feet spread 	Deciduous Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Long-blooming, early summer through fall Flowers orange and yellow	
Hemerocallis <i>Daylily</i> 	1-3 feet tall 1-3 feet spread 	Evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Blooms new flowers each day from early summer until a frost. Grass-like foliage. Flowers yellow, purple, red, orange, or pink.	
Coneflower <i>Echinacea purpurea</i> 	2-3 feet tall 1-2 feet spread 	Deciduous (melts to ground for winter) Hardy to 15 degrees	Long-blooming, starting in early summer Flowers purple, white, pink, red, or a mix ('Cheyenne Spirit' variety blooms multiple colors)	

Autumn Sage <i>Salvia greggii</i> 	2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet spread 	Semi-evergreen Hardy to 15 degrees	Long-blooming, early summer until a frost <i>Flowers pink, red, white, purple, or yellow</i> 
Lavender <i>Lavandula</i> 	2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet spread 	Evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Long-blooming, early summer until a frost <i>Flowers purple</i> *Spanish Lavender blooms in spring and has a ball-shaped flower 
Yarrow <i>Achillea</i> 	2-4 feet tall 1-3 feet spread 	Semi-evergreen Hardy to minus 20 degrees	Long-blooming flat flowers, starting in early summer. Fern-like foliage. <i>Flowers yellow, red, pink, purple, or white.</i> 
Gopher Spurge <i>Euphorbia</i> 	2-4 feet tall 2-4 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to minus 10 degrees	Colorful foliage, yellow spring flowers. Irritable milky substance within plant repels gophers and deer. <i>Foliage may be red-purple, green, blue-green, or yellow variegated</i> Deer rating: 9/10 

Black Eyed Susan <i>Rudbeckia hirta</i> 	2-4 feet tall 1-3 feet spread (and spreads by seed) 	Deciduous (melts to ground for winter) Hardy to minus 20 degrees	Long-blooming, early summer until a frost <i>Flowers yellow with brown center or with shades of orange</i>	
Russian Sage <i>Perovskia atriplicifolia</i> 	2-4 feet tall 2-4 feet wide 	Deciduous (melts to ground for winter) Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Wispy, grey-green, fragrant foliage. Delicate, lavender-blue flowers begin in early summer. <i>'Little Spire' variety only grows 1.5-2 feet tall.</i>	



→ this symbol indicates plants that can survive drought once established. It typically takes 1-2 years of regular water for a new plant to be established. In general, plants look better with regular water, but drought-tolerant plants can survive times when water is not available.



→ this symbol indicates plants that are considered fire-wise, meaning that they are more resistant to wildfire due to their growth habits. Plants with this symbol were found online in lists of 'fire safe' plants.

Seaside Daisy <i>Erigeron glaucus</i> 	8-12 inches tall 18-24 inches wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 5 degrees	Blue-green leaves mat close to ground. Long-blooming with daisy-like flowers spring to fall. Blooms purple or almost white with yellow center. Deer rating: 8/10	
Woolly Sunflower <i>Eriophyllum lanatum</i> <i>'Siskiyou'</i> 	10-12 inches tall 2-3 feet wide	Evergreen Hardy to minus 15 degrees	Lush, grey-green woolly foliage forms low mat. Cheery golden-yellow daisy flowers beginning in spring. Long-blooming.	
Coyote Mint <i>Monardella odorissima</i> 	12-18 inches tall 2-3 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 0 degrees	Member of mint family. Mounding plant with grey-green aromatic leaves. Tight heads of white to purple flowers in summer. Drought-tolerant once established.	

California Fuchsia <i>Zauschneria (Epilobium)</i> 	1-2 feet tall 2-4 feet spread 	Evergreen Hardy to 10 degrees	May be low growing or upright. Showy orange trumpet flowers in summer and fall. Loved by hummingbirds. Drought-tolerant once established.	
Pacific Coast Hybrid Iris <i>Iris PCH</i> 	12-18 inches tall 2-3 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 5 degrees	Clumps of sword-shaped, arching green blades. Flowers in spring. Usually flowers blue-purple but can range from pale cream to yellow to reddish-purple.	
Meadow Penstemon <i>Penstemon heterophyllus</i> 	18-24 inches tall 2-3 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 15 degrees	Deep green, narrow leaves. Spikes of tubular, violet-blue flowers begin in late spring. Very striking flowers.	
California Aster <i>Aster chilensis 'Purple Haze'</i> 	2-3 feet tall 2-3 feet wide <i>Spreads vigorously by rhizomes in wet areas</i>	Deciduous Hardy to 10 degrees	Attractive foliage consists of narrowly oval green leaves. Lavender-purple daisy flowers in summer. Long-blooming. Drought-tolerant once established.	

Monkeyflower <i>Mimulus aurantiacus</i> 	3-4 feet tall 2-3 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 15 degrees	Sticky green leaves. Blooms spring-summer with showy flowers that are usually yellow or orange, but some varieties have red.	
Pozo Blue Sage <i>Salvia x 'Pozo Blue'</i> 	3-4 feet tall 3-4 feet wide 	Evergreen Hardy to 15 degrees	Grey-green fragrant foliage. Tall, showy spikes of violet-blue flowers in summer. Loved by hummingbirds. Drought-tolerant once established.
